The PA Christmas Raffle raised €1069.00


The Student Council Movie Night raised €716 (€641.40 after expenses).

Our soon to be graduates in their 6th Class Hoodies organised by the Parents in 6th Class.


Can't believe they've only 5 months left in primary school
